

IACP Introductory and Introductory Interdisciplinary Collaborative Practice Training

IACP Training FAQs

IACP strongly encourages an introductory training which includes three trainers, one from each of the core professional disciplines: legal, mental health and financial. Though IACP does not mandate a full interdisciplinary training team, any community seeking an IACP Training will be encouraged to bring in a full interdisciplinary team.

Communities which are unable to bring three professionals for an IACP Training will be offered an alternate trainer configuration in accordance with IACP Standards and the community's needs.

An IACP Training may be contracted under the following terms and conditions:

1. Either an existing legal entity (such as an incorporated Practice Group or professional association) or two individuals, at least one of whom has completed a basic CP training, will enter into a contract with IACP.
2. An IACP Training may only be provided in the city or surrounding geographic community in which the hosting organization or individuals reside and work.
3. Ten days prior to the scheduled training date, there must be sufficient registrants to cover the contracted costs. In the event that there are not, IACP reserves the right to cancel the training.
4. In order to keep this training opportunity affordable, registration fees will be set between \$395 and \$550 USD. Adjustment may be made for trainings provided outside of North America.
5. The hosting organization/individuals will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Reimbursement to IACP for the costs of trainer(s) (fees, hotel, airfare, ground transportation and trainers' per diem for travel days and training days)
 - b. Reimbursement to IACP for costs of manual and handouts
 - c. All management, contracting, implementation and costs associated with marketing, registration, venue, food and beverage needs, AV equipment
 - d. Obtaining accreditation and/or CLE credits, if desired
 - e. Translation and/or interpretation services and costs, if desired.
 - f. Insurance as required by venue
6. Hosts will provide to IACP a roster of registrants with contact information.
7. In the event that a training generates profit for the hosting organization/individuals, it is strongly encouraged that such profits are used to "pay it forward" through offering Forum scholarships to the group's members or otherwise supporting IACP through a donation to its Annual Campaign.
8. IACP will have complete discretion over whether or not to provide training at the request of any host(s). IACP reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to decline any request for IACP Training.
