STEPHEN H. SULMEYER, J.D., Ph.D. is a lawyer, clinical psychologist, mediator, trainer, and collaborative divorce coach in Marin County, California. He specializes in complex and high-conflict disputes in a wide range of subject areas, including family and divorce, probate and elder, family businesses, business/commercial, intellectual property, employment, discrimination, partnerships, personal injury, and community matters. He is particularly skilled at getting to the heart of the human issues that tend to drive most disputes and create obstacles to settlement. In particular, his years of working with people and organizations in conflict has convinced him of the value of identifying and working with, rather than shying away from, the underlying psychological obstacles that are often the real barriers to the resolution of conflicts. By attending to all aspects of disputes, Steve has found that parties are generally able to achieve the most comprehensive and durable results, and to maximize efficiency and conservation of resources. Steve is also a trainer both in psychology and in various modalities of dispute resolution.
