MAINTENANCE (SPOUSAL SUPPORT) FACTORS:

“The court may order maintenance...in such amounts and for such periods of time as the court deems just, without regards to misconduct, after considering all the relevant factors, including but not limited to:”

- Financial resources of the party seeking maintenance (including assets, income and child support, ability to meet needs independently);
- Time required for recipient to acquire education or skills to find employment appropriate to his/her circumstances;
- Standard of living during the marriage;
- Duration of the marriage;
- Age, health and financial obligations of the recipient;
- Ability of payor to meet his/her own needs and financial obligations.

ASSET/DEBT DIVISION FACTORS:

“The court shall, without regard to misconduct, make such disposition of the property and the liabilities of the parties, either community or separate, as shall appear just and equitable after considering all relevant factors including, but not limited to:”

- The nature and extent of community property;
- The nature and extent of separate property;
- The duration of the marriage;
- The economic circumstances of each spouse.
